Dear Dr. Hertz,

Parts I, II and V of the International Bibliography on Atomic Energy have been issued in preliminary form, thus completing the preliminary edition. A copy of these parts has been sent to you under separate cover.

We are now undertaking the revision and correction of all parts of the bibliography. The additions contained in your letter of 26 November 1948 are deeply appreciated and will be included in the published edition of the bibliography to be put out later this year.

Several months of use of Parts III and IV have doubtless revealed other errors and defects. While we are anxious to reduce these to a minimum, we are largely dependent in this task upon the criticism of specialists.

May I therefore take the liberty of requesting you to forward any further comments of a detailed nature. Suggestions along the following lines will be particularly welcomed:

- (1) Personal or any specialized bibliographies, published or unpublished.
- (2) Any corrections and suggestions for the addition or deletion of material.
- (3) Suggestions concerning the scope of the bibliography and the arrangement of subjects.
- (4) The names of persons who might supply additional material, or whose criticism would be valuable.
